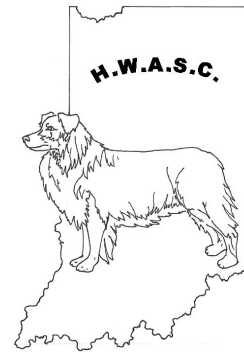

Cattle: \$40 Sheep: \$35 Ducks: \$25
Ranch Trial (limited to 14 runs, with a maximum of 9 cattle runs or 12 sheep runs): \$50 per class
Day-of entries, if available, will be an additional \$5.00 per class

Pre-entries: Entries must be postmarked between August 4, 2008 (opening date) and August 23, 2008 (closing date). A waiting list will be established if the trial fills with names added according to the order of receipt of entry forms by **postmark date**. Please include your e-mail address for confirmation of entries. Entries are non-refundable after the closing date.

ASCA RULES STATE ENTRIES WILL BE FILLED BY POSTMARK DATE ORDER. OVERNIGHT ENTRIES ARE NOT NECESSARY! ENTRIES REQUIRING A SIGNATURE WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Correct amount must accompany entry form. Postdated checks will not qualify as a valid pre-entry. Any checks returned for insufficient funds will be considered a void entry. There is a \$25 service charge for returned checks. Entry forms can be downloaded from the ASCA website at <http://www.asca.org/Forms+and+Rule+Books> under the heading of "Stockdog Forms."

Stock: 3 head commercial beef steers, 3 head commercial hair sheep, 5 head Indian Runner or Blue Swede ducks.
Ranch trial: 10 head of sheep and cattle.

Awards:

Weekend awards:

Belt buckles will be awarded for the following high combined awards. Highest accumulated points for the weekend, qualifying scores only. Same dog in all three classes of stock.

HIGH COMBINED WTCH AUSSIE: Dog that has earned the WTCH title before the first trial started

HIGH COMBINED NON-WTCH AUSSIE: Dog that has not earned the WTCH title before the first trial started

MOST PROMISING STARTED AUSSIE: All points must be earned in the started classes

HIGH COMBINED OTHER BREED: highest combined scores over both trials from any division on all classes of stock

Daily awards:

1st - 4th place – flat ribbons.

Qualifying score ribbons to all qualifiers in Regular classes

Rosettes will be awarded for High scores in Advanced, Open and Started. HIT aussie, HIT Other breed and High scoring Junior.

Notice to Exhibitors

This trial is open to all eligible herding breeds under ASCA rules.

Owners of dogs will be responsible for all injuries to livestock. Injury: vet on-call fee. Stock replacement: Ducks - \$25.00, Sheep \$200.00, Cattle - \$ Market value

ASCA tracking numbers are required for non-ASCA registered dogs who are competing for titles through ASCA.

Entry fees will not be refunded if the show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire and/or dangerous weather conditions, acts of God, public emergencies, acts of a public enemy, strikes, or other causes beyond the control of HWASC. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by a veterinarian or judge, or barred from competition by the Trial Committee.

Random drawing will choose the order of entries with postmarks of the same date. Bitches in season will run last.

Each owner/handler is responsible for their dog(s). Dogs must be confined or on lead at all times, except when competing. Dogs are not allowed to run loose. Dog owners are required to pick up after their dogs

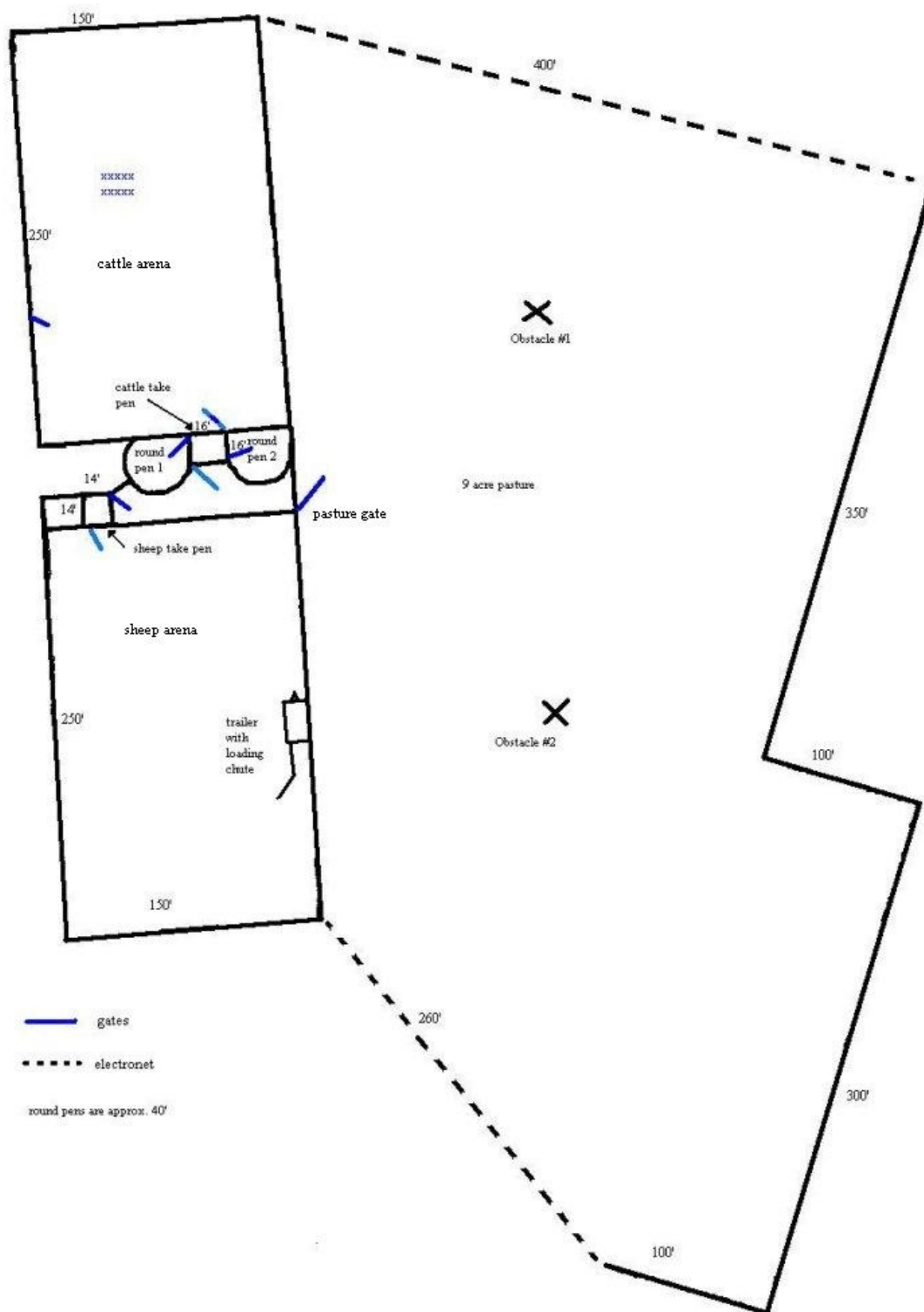

Ranch Trial Diagram



Ranch Trial Description - Time 20 minutes

Step 1 - Gather stock from cattle arena - drive or fetch stock through cattle take pen and north through gate into 9 acre pasture, then take stock around obstacle #1 and then obstacle #2, then bring stock back into the pasture gate.

Step 2 - Move stock through cattle take pen into round pen #1. Gate sort 5 head of marked stock into take pen, then move the marked stock into round pen #2

Step 3 - Gather stock from round pen #1 and move them through the sheep take pen, into the sheep arena.

Step 4 - Return to round pen #2 and move second group of stock through the sheep take pen, into the sheep arena.

Step 5 - Gather all head of stock in sheep arena and move into loading chute, loading stock into stock trailer. **Finished**
